I'm afraid I'm not familiar with the MX 2000 library system as I have never worked with it. However, I worked in a school library in London for about six years, and the system we used there was very similar. In fact, I think it was an early version of MX 2000.

You also want an experienced Internet user for this position. I started a part-time course for Internet researchers and web page designers two and a half years ago. I haven't finished the course yet, but the content is certainly relevant to the skills you mentioned in your advertisement. We have already had several weeks' practical experience of doing Internet research, and I am now in the middle of a project to design a simple online handbook for new Internet users. The course will finish at the end of this year.
