
Play your part 1

Christopher and Sharon Kent have got a problem. Here is some background information about the situation that is causing them sleepless nights. Read the information carefully.

Background information

- The Kents have got three children: Simon (18 years old), Jane (16) and Tom (8).
- The Kents live in a relatively cheap, rented flat in a medium-sized town.
- The flat is about ten minutes away from Christopher's office by car.
- Christopher Kent has got an interesting job in a large publishing company.
- Sharon Kent is a part-time nurse at a hospital in the town where they live.
- Sharon's mother died five years ago. In her will she left the family home to her daughter. She also expressed the wish that the family should live in the house.
- The house is in the country, over an hour away from Christopher's office by car.
- The house needed a lot of renovation work – which was more expensive than they had expected.
- The Kents decided not to move into the house immediately after the renovation had been completed. They had borrowed a lot of money from the bank and wanted to pay some of that money back.
- When they advertised for tenants, several people offered to buy it at a good price. The Kents have refused to sell up to now.
- They let the house to a successful writer and her husband. She's just finished her new novel and they're going to move out in a couple of months.
