1. The best symbol of Bombay for the author is ... (tick one option)

- the historic Gateway of India.
- the Gothic, gargoled Victoria Terminus.
- the white Gandhi cap.
- the little man who delivers innumerable lunches.

2. Which of the following statements are true of a dabbawalla? (tick two options)

- He carries almost forty dabbas on a long tray.
- He weighs more than 50 kilograms.
- Even in difficult situations, the meals reach their destination in time.
- He presses his hand on the lid of the dabba to prevent food from splashing out.
- He wears fancy clothes, especially in summer.

3. Why is the dabbawalla system called both complex and simple (cf. II. 29-30)? Explain in one or two sentences.

It is complex because of the huge number of individual trays to be transported and the area to be covered. But it is simple because no advanced technology is used.

4. What are the main reasons why many workers use this system? Look at II. 40-45, 79-81.
