A really fascinating "real time counter" is the "Worldometer", for example. It covers many areas, e.g. word population, government and economics, society and media, environment, food, water, energy, and health. In "About Us", the people responsible for the real time counters state that the "counters that display the real-time numbers are based on Worldometers' algorithm that processes the latest and most accurate statistical data available together with its estimated progression to compute the current millisecond number to be displayed on each counter based on the specific time set on each visitor's computer clock." This is how I can say that, for example, today (2012-06-13, 21:40h) as many as 339,612,973,803 e-mails have already been sent.

B GARY'S SOCIAL MEDIA COUNT

Similar to the "Worldometer", *Gary's Social Media Count* computes figures from statistical data and does not calculate real-time figures. With buttons in the top right corner of the app you can choose the categories "social", "mobile", "games", and "heritage" in different time spans: now, +1 day, +1 week, +1 month, and +1 year.
