A IMPROVING READING COMPREHENSION

You'll find reading comprehension questions in almost every school tests and all major standardized tests. In order to be able to answer the questions, you must fully understand what you read. Here are some tips:

- look up unknown words and write down their German or English meaning
- in your Viewfinder Topics books: study the vocabulary and explanations that go with the text
- take notes (on the margin or a separate piece of paper)
- highlight important ideas, arguments and statements
- learn the function of paragraphs: find out what the point of the paragraph is (underline it!) and where the supplemental information is

B MULTIPLE CHOICE QUESTIONS
