A STATISTICS BY IPSOS MORI

Ipsos Mori is one of the largest and best known research companies in the UK. Its website www.ipsos-mori.com (please copy and paste this hyperlink into your browser) includes a social research on the attitude of the British population towards fascinating issues like Christmas, the Royal Family, politics, Europe and religion.

In their 2011 "North Poll" (what a great pun!), for example, they did research on children's attitude to Christmas** and found that 83% of parents with a child aged 3 to 6 years old think their child believes in Father Christmas. Oddly enough, as many as 8% of parents of 11 to 15 year old kids do so, too!
