The Task

Learners answer questions about London.

Procedure

Learners work in pairs or groups. Make one copy of the copymaster for each team and cut it up into cards. The teams now try to answer the questions. Do not give any help or answers at this stage.

When the teams cannot get any further, hand out cut-up copies of the answers page and let learners match them with the question cards. See also the notes below.

- 13. Strictly speaking, someone who was born within the sound of the church bells of St Mary-le-Bow, Cheapside ("Bow bells").
- 21. A World War 2 battle cruiser, moored by Tower Bridge.
- 24. Originally the name of the largest bell which chimes the hours, named after Sir Benjamin Hall, Chief Commissioner of Works in 1858 when the bell was hung.

Extra Activity
